



Hooray, HIP for Telok Blangah and West Coast

Good news, your homes have been selected for the Home Improvement Programme (HIP). The extra boost to the new year festivities were received by residents of selected blocks in Telok Blangah and West Coast in January.


Their homes will be improved, made more comfortable and safer. Even better, most of the improvements will not cost a cent, while optional items will be heavily subsidised.

The good news was brought by Mr Lim Hng Kiang, Adviser to Telok Blangah Grassroots Organisations and Mr S Iswaran, Adviser to West Coast Grassroots Organisations.

The selected units for HIP are at Block 84 Telok Blangah Heights and Blocks 501, 504 and 505 West Coast Drive, and Blocks 721, 722, 725 and 727 Clementi West Street 2.


HIP provides for Essential upgrades necessary for public health and safety including replacement of waste pipes and repair of spalling concrete and Optional upgrades such as upgrading of toilet/bathrooms and replacing entrance doors. In addition the Enhancement for Active Seniors programme (EASE) will improve the flat interior to enhance the safety and comfort of seniors including the installation of grab bars and slip-resistant treatment to bathroom or toilet floor tiles.

The Government would fully fund the cost of Essential items for citizen households and subsidise up to 95% of Optional and EASE upgrades. 75% of eligible owners must vote for the HIP to proceed.




Mr Lim Hng Kiang, urging residents to vote for HIP, said “The block was completed more than 20 years ago and with the close ties that you share with your neighbours, your neighbourhood is an endearing home to many of you... HIP will allow residents to continue living in the neighbourhood by rejuvenating your flats.”

Over at West Coast, Mr Iswaran said to residents: “To keep HIP and EASE affordable, the Government will subsidise up to 95% of the total cost for Singapore households... For those with financial concerns, let me assure you that HDB has various assistance measures to ensure that no Singaporean household will be deprived of the benefits of HIP and EASE.”









Operating Income for FY17/18





Operating Expenditure for FY17/18







West Coast gets thumbs up for Estate Management

West Coast Town has achieved 'green' results in the Town Council Management Report for the financial year 2017 covering the period April 2017 to March 2018.

The report covered five areas of assessment: Estate Cleanliness, Estate Maintenance, Lift Performance, Service & Conservancy Charge Arrears Management, and Corporate Governance. How clean was it? Was it well maintained? Did the lifts perform well? And were arrears of service and conservancy charges kept low? The five areas were then rated at three levels, green, amber and red, with green being the best.

West Coast's green results for all areas of assessment reflect the collective effort of the Town Council and residents. Residents play an important role in the upkeep of the estate, through simple acts such as refraining from littering, vandalism or tampering with common property. Residents deserve a pat on the back for the achievement. By working hand in hand with the Town Council in taking good care of our estate, we will make West Coast Town a home all of us can be proud of.

[1] If the result for lift performance is green, this generally means that for every 10 lifts, less than 2 breakdowns occur per month and less than 2 in 100 lifts have a non-functioning ARD.

[2] If the result for S&CC arrears is green, this generally means that less than 4 in 100 households owe arrears for 3 months or more and less than 40% of the monthly collectible S&CC for the town is overdue.



Coming your way: Lifts at pedestrian overhead bridges

Pedestrian Overhead Bridges (POB) over the Ayer Rajah Expressway (AYE) will soon be retrofitted with lifts to make it more convenient and safer for residents when they cross over to Clementi Town from West Coast.

These will be at three existing POBs along AYE near The Parc Condominium, Block 506 West Coast Drive, and Block 610 Clementi West Street 1. The ground breaking for the project was launched by Mr S Iswaran, Adviser to West Coast GROs on 27th and 28th October 2018 respectively. It is scheduled to be completed in mid-2020.

In addition, the launch of Silver Zone Consultation @ West Coast Vista by LTA would provide West Coast residents with more convenience and safety features at the Silver Zone along Clementi West Street 2.
