# Every Singaporean Household Will Receive \$300 CDC Vouchers in January 2025

The CDC Vouchers Scheme 2025 (January) is part of the enhancements to the Assurance Package announced by then Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Finance Lawrence Wong at Budget 2024. The package provides more immediate support for Singaporean households and helps defray daily expenses.

Starting 3 January 2025, you can visit [go.gov.sg/cdcv](https://go.gov.sg/cdcv) to claim the **\$300 CDC vouchers**. The process for claiming and spending the vouchers remains the same.

The CDC Vouchers Scheme 2025 (January) is valid till **31 December 2025**.

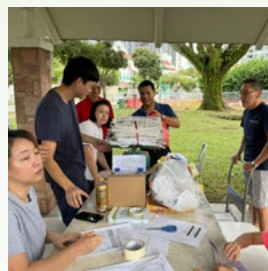
## Festive Cheer in West Coast — Celebrating Together

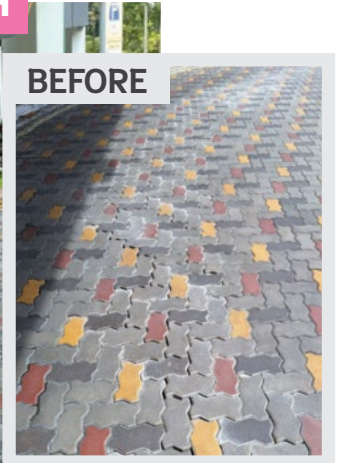
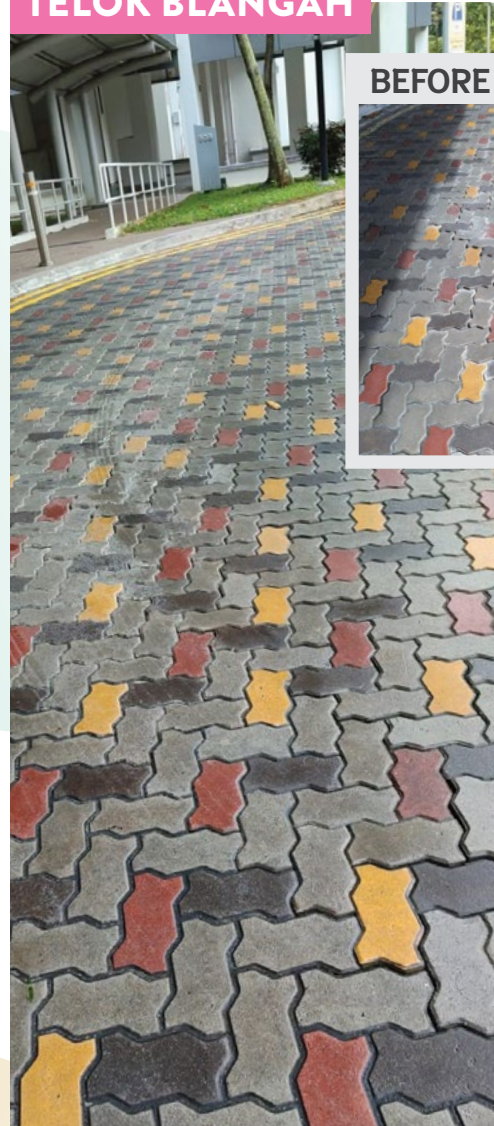

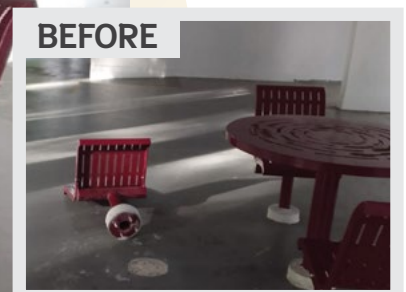

# Office concept at Teban Gardens Market, while keeping the *Kampung Spirit*

At Teban Gardens Market, where vendors' chatter and the aroma of fresh produce fill the air, Ms Tara Tan carries on her family's legacy of hard work, generosity, and community spirit. You must have seen her on social media recently as well!

For Ms Tara, the market is more than just a place of business — it is home. Having taken over the stall from her mother during the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020, she now carries on the traditions of her family and the close-knit relationships that define the market culture.

In an ever-modernising Singapore, Ms Tara and her fellow vendors work tirelessly to preserve the cherished kampung spirit. The market is a living testament to the values of unity and kindness, where stall owners share breakfast, exchange festive gifts, and lend a helping hand whenever needed. For Ms Tara, this sense of belonging is deeply personal. "The ladies around my stall are all my 'Ibu' — they have seen me grow from a child to who I am today."

Ms Tara recalls her childhood days spent helping her mother at the stall. Even then, she was motivated by the business. "I love money," she laughs. "And in the market, I get to see cash — it drives me to work harder and eventually take over the shop." But for her, it is about more than just earnings. She keeps her prices low, knowing that many elderly residents cook for themselves and need smaller portions. "I sell *taugeh* (bean sprouts) at just 20 cents so they don't have to buy in bulk and waste food."

Her generosity extends beyond pricing. "I don't always weigh my items for the smaller quantities. I give a little extra because one day, when I grow old, I want to be treated the same way I treat others now." It is this philosophy that endears her to so many and keeps customers returning. They know they are not just buying food but experiencing kindness in its purest form.



Despite the changing times, Ms Tara and her fellow vendors are determined to keep the market culture alive. "It's like running an office," she explains, "but in a market, we are all different departments helping one another. If a customer needs ingredients for Curry Mee, I send them to the chicken and dry items shop."

With younger generations taking over family businesses, there is hope that this way of life will persist. "We don't know if such markets will exist in 10 or 15 years," Ms Tara reflects, "but we will do everything we can to keep this tradition alive, because one day, we will want others to do the same for us."

For now, the Teban Gardens Market remains a thriving hub of culture, warmth, and unwavering community spirit — where business is built on friendship, and every transaction carries a touch of heartfelt generosity.
