# DRIVE GREEN, CHARGE CLEAN



Residents who own Electric Vehicles (EVs) will soon find greater convenience in juicing up their vehicles as car parks in Telok Blangah division and Boon Lay division unveiled new Charging Stations on 23 February 2023 by Transport Minister S. Iswaran (MP for West Coast GRC).

In March last year, Pioneer division was amongst the first in Singapore to have charging points installed at car parks under LTA-URA's pilot tender. Next to begin the EV charging journey were Telok Blangah and Boon Lay, whose new charging stations can now be found at Block 80D Telok Blangah Street 31 and Block 212A Boon Lay Place respectively.

LTA-appointed vendors (e.g. ChargEco and Charge+) will be working with West Coast Town Council to install more charging points around West Coast Town over the coming months. Residents can expect a more robust EV charging ecosystem very soon!

Accelerating the expansion of EV charging infrastructure, Singapore has been promoting the adoption of cleaner-energy vehicles as part of its efforts to achieve a sustainable and low-carbon future.

Some 60,000 charging points are expected to be available nationwide to support the demand by 2030. By the end of 2023, around 2,000 charging points are set to be installed in more than 700 HDB carparks, or one-third of all HDB car parks in Singapore. By 2025, the goal is to have at least 12,000 such points available.






# GREEN YOUR ROUTINE



Have you spotted these large blue machines around your neighbourhood and wondered what they are for?

These machines have been placed around West Coast Town to encourage the recycling of Paper and Textiles amongst residents, and are one of the innovative measures the West Coast Town Council has implemented as part of the PAP Action for Green Towns initiative. To date, an impressive 1 ton of paper (the equivalent of saving 17 trees) is recycled per month per machine.

Recycling is an important aspect of Singapore's waste management plan as we work towards the national goal of reducing the waste sent to landfills by 30% by 2030. Before you throw something away, pause and ask yourself whether the item can be recycled. Whether it is a used textbook or an old t-shirt, they all can find new life if they are properly disposed of at recycling machines.

For making the effort, the SGRecycle Machines even reward users for their deposits! Every 1,000 points collected allows a redemption of \$10 via PayNow, Bank Transfer, or EZ-Link Credit Vouchers.

Ms. Christine, a Jurong West resident, has been diligently recycling paper and cardboard at the machine since it was launched in late 2021. She shares that the addition of the textile machine allows her and her family a convenient option of recycling unused or unwanted clothing or shoes.





# SUPPORTING FAMILIES, SUPPORTING BUSINESSES

Have you claimed your \$300 Community Development Council (CDC) vouchers?

On 3 January 2023, all Singaporean households will receive \$300 worth of vouchers as part of the enhanced support under the Assurance Package to help cushion the impact of additional Goods & Services Tax (GST).

You can spend them at over 20,300 participating hawkers and heartland merchants island-wide, and do your part in supporting local businesses in West Coast GRC and beyond. You can use the vouchers to buy pet food, get a haircut, treat yourself to a manicure, and many more!

Furthermore, greater flexibility has also been introduced in this year's disbursement: Half of the CDC vouchers value (i.e. \$150) can now be used at places like HAO Mart, NTUC FairPrice, Prime Supermarket, Sheng Siong and U Stars Supermarket for the buying of groceries and other essentials.

## **How to Claim Your CDC Vouchers?**

The CDC Vouchers are digital, and come in denominations of \$2, \$5, and \$10.

# Coming Soon: 95,000 New Jobs in Singapore's First Mixed-Used District

esidents at Gek Poh North will be living in Singapore's first mixed-use district for advanced manufacturing from 2024. Bulim Park will open in phases to bring together a growing ecosystem of research institutions, capability developers, training and technology firms and manufacturers. 95,000 new jobs will be located here, said MP Ms Foo Mee Har. "Bulim Park will bring 14 play zones, a fitness area, a community plaza and exciting F&B facilities," she said. "When I made home visits at Blks 274C and 274D, residents showed much interest in the developments around our estate."

# FALLING OFF THE BONE

#### Quick tips to manage injuries associated with falls

#### #Didyouknow

that falls are the leading cause of traumatic injuries in Singapore? Senior citizens account for the majority of patients received and treated at the hospital.

Common types of injuries resulting from falls include:

- 1) Wrist and hip fractures
- Head injuries
- 3) Bleeding wounds

Injuries range from mild to severe, some may also be fatal. While we practice fall prevention at home, it is also important to be equipped with first aid know-hows while waiting for professional help.



"From the time of injury, every second counts towards saving a life and improving the rate of recovery."

#### Call 995 (SCDF-EMS)

If patient is unconscious or has suffered a severe injury.



#### **Wrist Fractures**

Apply a splint or arm sling to immobilize and minimize movements that will worsen the injury. Seek medical attention.



#### **Hip Fractures**

If the patient is in pain and unable to move, seek immediate help by calling an ambulance. Do not attempt to move him or her as it may worsen the injury.



#### **Head Injuries**

Signs and symptoms of head damage may be overlooked (e.g. headaches, nausea or dizziness). Seek immediate help for further tests.



#### **Bleeding Wounds**

Stop the bleed by using a clean cloth over the wound and applying firm constant pressure. Wrap the wound with a sterile gauze and bandage.




